Day 3 - Girls camp

The day started with Fajr Salah, and all the campers were so efficient to wake up, do wuhdu and get ready with time to spare before adhan.

After a post Fajr nap, the mentors woke up the campers, and ushered them to get ready and then have a delicious breakfast of cereal, chai and scrambled eggs, fuelling up before the girls head to their classes. Planet Venus did so well to clear up after breakfast, wiping down the tables and hoovering the dining room.

Today's class with Raihana Bai focused on Imam Sajjad and the duas he has blessed us with in Sahifa Sajjadiya. She discussed the dua burger that involves the salwat as the buns, with the praises of Allah, asking others for forgiveness and then asking for your own repentance as the burger filling.

In Zameena D Bai's class the campers reflected on the Holy Quran and what it means to be a good person. They reflected on different scenarios around morals and how sometimes it's hard to make the morally right decisions therefore Allah (SWT) gives us quidance through the Quran to help us.

In Zamina R Bai's class the campers discussed different communication techniques and the role of body language in conversation and non verbal cues. They delved into the tricky scenarios such as what to do when faced with handshaking with a male, and how to respectfully decline to maintain hijab.

The campers were asked by Raihana Bai to each come up with a reflection from the days classes to present in the Muharram workshop, which they bonded and formulated together to present to the other girls later that day.


