

Our Priorities

Sustainability

Ensuring the long-term financial health of our Jamaats was a critical focus this year. CoEJ invested in real estate ventures, such as the joint property purchase with Leeds, Essex, and Milton Keynes Jamaats, to build a resilient financial portfolio. Additionally, we streamlined internal processes, including the efficient management of the Imam Reza Hardship Fund, ensuring that resources were allocated effectively to support those in need within our community

Community

CoEJ actively promoted collaboration through joint projects and events. Following the effects of the pandemic, CoEJ restarted camp CoEJ, the LDP, and actively engaged with the grassroots with digital content.

Empowerment

CoEJ organised several initiatives to cultivate the next generation of leaders. This included the Leadership Development Programs (LDP), where young adults were equipped with essential skills and knowledge to take on leadership roles. Additionally, Camp CoEJ provided a platform for youths to engage in mentorship and self-development activities, while regular creative contests encouraged the expression of their talents and ideas.



The CoEJ Secretariat has played a pivotal role in coordinating and supporting the various activities and initiatives of our organization over the past year. As the central hub of operations, the secretariat has ensured that our diverse range of projects, from community outreach programs to international collaborations, have been executed efficiently and effectively.



The Treasury oversees a range of essential functions within CoEJ, including **budgeting**, **financial planning**, **and investment management**. These efforts ensure that we can continue to fund important projects, support our member Jamaats, and invest in initiatives that drive growth and **development** within our community.

Among its key initiatives is the Imam Reza Hardship Fund, designed to provide financial assistance to community members facing unexpected difficulties.

Our goal is to maintain a robust financial **structure** that enables CoEJ to fulfil its mission and vision for years to come.









Streamlining processes

By implementing modern financial management systems and best practices, we have improved transparency, accountability, and responsiveness across all our financial operations.

Our new accounting software is Liberty. This is a UK-based piece of accounting software with special support for non-profits. Charity focused functionality includes specific fund management and tools to help streamline the process of claiming gift aid.

There is specific fund accounting and a simple one-click statement of financial activities, making it uncomplicated for SORP reporting. Collaboration and handovers are also easy on Liberty.

JOINT INVESTMENT VENTURE

In a significant move towards fostering community growth and collaboration, the Council of European Jamaats (CoEJ), in partnership with the Jamaats of Leeds, Essex, and Milton Keynes, has **jointly purchased a property** at 7 Acacia Terrace, Seacroft, Leeds, West Yorkshire, LS14 6ZQ. This strategic investment aims to support and finance the objectives of the involved charities, **marking a new era of cooperation and shared vision.**

INVESTMENT UPDATES

Peterborough

CoEJ continues to actively manage its property portfolio, including two properties in Peterborough.

The Watergall property, initially valued at £135k, reached £210k by May 2024, while the Pendleton Drive property increased from £135k to £185k.

We have also been renovating the properties periodically and increasing rent when applicable (performing rent reviews to align with the market)

Leeds

In addition to the JIV, CoEJ acquired the property at 9 Acacia Terrace for £208k. This expansion strengthens their real estate portfolio, aimed at fostering long-term financial sustainability for our initiatives.





Southampton (KSIMC Investments Ltd)

CoEJ made an investment of approximately £50,000 in a project in Southampton, converting office spaces into six flats. The project. completed within budget, achieved a conservative total equity gain of £450k.

The project owns several properties on High Street. These investments contribute to long-term financial sustainability.

The board of the company contains equal representation from the founder members' capital contributions made. Profit generated by the company would be wholly distributed back to the founder members in line with their respective shareholdings.

As of August 2024, the total funds invested in KSIMC Investments Ltd amounts to £4.693m. This is split between the WF of KSIMC (87.01%) and CoEJ (12.99%) in terms of capital invested.











