Day 2 - Boys Camp

Today marks the second day of Camp CoEJ, as well as being our first official day at our campsite. The day began with Fajr namaz, where our campers were all exhausted from the excitement of meeting one another and playing games together all night. After Fajr, we all slept soundly and woke up around 8am for a wonderful breakfast of chai, croissants and fruit.

Shortly after 11am, we all packed up and loaded our suitcases onto the coach, setting off for the campsite, which is full of trees and greenery. Whilst the coach journey felt long to some, many of our happy little campers managed to catch some shut eye before we arrived at the campsite. The campers, as well as their mentors, all put their suitcases safely in the common rooms before the campers made their way to their first of three daily lessons. Whilst the children all got acquainted with their teachers, the mentors tirelessly took the campers' bags to their rooms and left fresh bedsheets for the campers to put on during our daily allocated planet time. The campers also took part in their first jamaat namaz at the campsite, with zuhr and asr jamaat being performed before lunchtime!







For lunch, the campers had a delicious meal of Spanish Chicken, which was served by our campers from Jupiter. Lots of campers enjoyed the flavour of the food, as a nice hearty meal was just what our little campers needed to keep their stomachs happy and their brains active for the rest of the day's lessons. This was followed by planet time, where our campers braved the treacherous task of having to make their own beds and settle in to their new rooms. Many of our campers used the time to also bond with each other, playing games such as 'Cover Your Assets' and 'Uno'.

This included a quiz on different football team logos and the translations of different names of Allah SWT from the Asma al-Husna. It was then time for the last two of our three daily lessons, where the children learned about understanding Salaah, parents in the Quran and the importance of collaboration and the 4 Cs with our teachers, dedicated to nurturing our campers to become more knowledgeable people by the end of Camp CoEJ.

Finally, we ended our evening with Maghrib and Isha Jamaat namaz. Everybody is positively excited at the thought of what activities we have planned for the rest of the week.


